# **Review of the year**

## **Reception**

Our reception children have settled into Infant school life really well over the past school year, from the shy and cautious group of new children that first entered the school gates to the confident and energetic little people that they are becoming, they have made so much progress over the past year and it has been a pleasure to watch them blossom. At Christmas they enjoyed going to watch Goldilocks and the three bears at Nottingham Playhouse and also a festive Christmas sing with our parents and carers in the playground. Over the year they have enjoyed many outings and trips including White Post Farm, where they got to meet lots of different animals. They also had trips around West Bridgford to see the local landmarks including the park and the library. They also took part in two different workshops: a 'Flight to Neverland' theatre session and also 'The power of the Drums' with Andy Harris.

#### <u>Year 1</u>

Our Year ones celebrated Superhero Day last October; the whole year came dressed as their favourite superheroes and the staff too! In April they enjoyed a trip to Tamworth Castle as part of their 'Homes and Castles' topic where they dressed up as knights and also climbed the tower.
