



I know that:

- Plants are a large group of living things.
- Plants have lots of different parts, for example stems, leaves and roots.
- Some trees lose their leaves in the winter (deciduous). Some keep their leaves through the year (evergreen).
- Some plants are 'flowering plants' – they grow flowers sometimes.

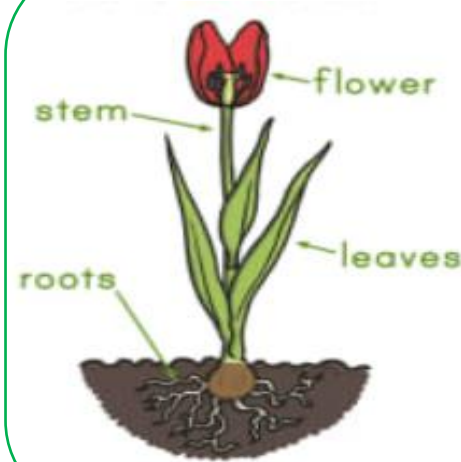
Wild plants - A wild plant seed grows where it falls. It doesn't need to be planted or cared for as it grows.

Garden plants – Garden plants are plants that people choose to grow in their gardens.

Weeds – Weeds are wild plants that grow in places where people don't want them.

Deciduous – A deciduous tree loses its leaves each year.

Evergreen - An evergreen tree keeps its green leaves all year round, even in the winter.



Root - Roots absorb water and minerals from the ground. They also help the plant to stay standing in the ground.

Stem – The stem supports the plant above the ground. It also helps to carry water and minerals from the roots to the leaves.

Leaf/leaves – Leaves collect energy from the Sun and turn this into food for the plant.

Flower – Flowers and fruits help the plant to attract insects to help them reproduce (to make more plants).
